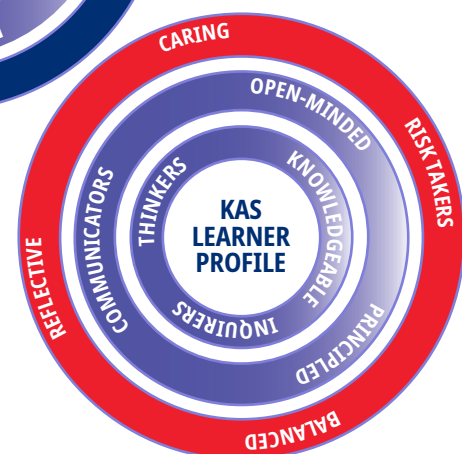
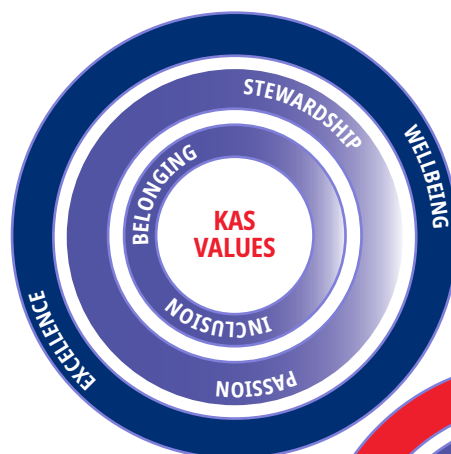

## ABOUT OUR SCHOOL

Kaohsiung American School is one of two international schools in Taiwan assisted by the U.S. State Department's Office of Overseas Schools. KAS was founded in 1989 to serve expatriate and internationally-minded families in southern Taiwan. We are an independent, non-profit, co-educational K-12 school with 781 students, 268 of whom are in grades 9-12. We are governed by an elected Board of Directors which includes a representative of the American Institute in Taiwan, Kaohsiung Branch Office.

Through holistic, inclusive learning in academics, athletics, and the arts, we foster passionate and curious critical thinkers who grow into aware, ethical, and cooperative global citizens. Accredited by the Western Association of Schools & Colleges, we award an American high school diploma to all our graduates. In high school, learning is guided by the International Baccalaureate Middle Years and Diploma programs, and all students have the opportunity to earn the IB Diploma.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

All KAS graduates earn a regionally accredited American high school diploma. In grades 11–12, students may elect to take IB courses or complete the IB Diploma Program, comprised of six academic courses in addition to the IB Extended Essay, Theory of Knowledge course (TOK), and Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS). Students also may opt out of the full IB Diploma for a more flexible or focused program of study.

ONLINE LEARNING FOR HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT

KAS is a member of the Global Online Academy (GOA) consortium of leading independent schools. KAS students in grades 9–12 have access to rigorous, diverse honors-level GOA online courses.

Students may take online AP courses or online IB courses (through Pamoja Education). These courses appear on the HS transcript for HS credit. They are offered on a pass/fail basis.

Candidates for the full IB Diploma in grades 11–12 may *not* take online courses outside of the IB Diploma Program.

GRADING SCALE

**We do not rank students.** We calculate a GPA on a 4.33 scale, A+ through F, for all classes completed on campus at KAS in grades 9 through 12. Students in grades 11 and 12 have the option to take IB courses. Only students who complete IB courses at Higher Level have a weighted GPA because we add one extra quality point for HL courses. Students without IB HL courses have an unweighted GPA.

COUNSELING PRACTICES

The KAS college counseling office follows the National Association for College Admission Counseling’s Guide to Ethical Practice in College Admission. We hold memberships in the International Association for College Admission Counseling (IACAC) and the International School Counseling Association (ISCA).

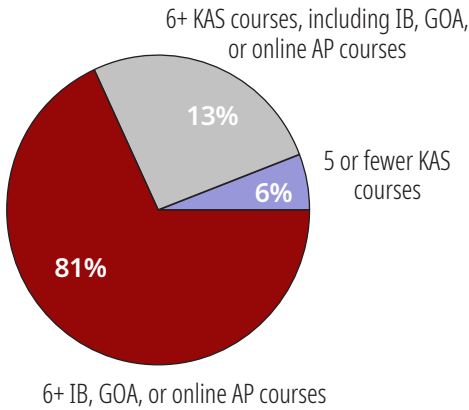

## COMMITMENT TO SERVICE

KAS students complete service in the community before graduation; IB Diploma candidates must complete 20 hours in addition to their CAS requirement. Over 75% of students participate in a student-led service club. Examples of service in recent years include cleaning beaches, teaching English at a local middle school, and contributing to infrastructure projects in an Indigenous Taiwanese community.

## SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS

**Future Leader Program (FLP):** The FLP is a groundbreaking program that roots KAS students within the broader community of southern Taiwan. Students apply to a selective program for internships at educational and health institutions, NGOs, universities, and companies. A mentor guides them through a substantive internship experience. Students must complete 40 hours and participate in evaluation and reflection.

**Diversity, equity, inclusion, and justice:** In accordance with our school values, we are proud of our institutional commitment to inclusion and social justice. Our community is a safe place for LGBTQ+ individuals and people of color to celebrate their identities; they are represented within our students, families, faculty, and administration.
